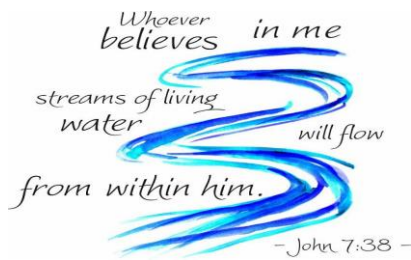

Reflections on Matthew 22: 34



This passage from Matthew's Gospel is very close to the Golden Rule following the Sermon on the Mount. Matthew 7: 12 (Jesus said) "In everything do to others as you would have them do to you; for this is the Law and the Prophets." So, this passage says the greatest Commandment is this. "You shall love the Lord, your God with all your heart, and with all your soul and with all your mind." Then Jesus goes on to say, "And the second is like it. 'You shall love your neighbour as you love yourself'. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets."

Twice we are told to treat others with love, respect, kindness and grace. HOW MANY TIMES DO WE NEED TO BE REMINDED?? All the law and all the prophets can be summed up in the way we treat others. So easy to say, and so hard to do! We people in the western culture are trained from birth to put ourselves in the centre of our thinking.

The economy of God throws all that away like dirty used water. This upside down God calls us to care for and accept that others need us to consider the Other as our equal, and we are called to make this our commandment to live by. We don't need to know every special verse in the Bible. We simply need to love our neighbour as we love ourselves. May our God of grace teach us all how to be people of love and grace. Amen.
