



### Sunday April 14th Luke 24: 36b- 38 Easter 3

We are on a spiritual journey through our season of Easter. While Year B is based around the Gospel of Mark, from time to time we will have passages from the other Gospel writers. This week is one of those, where we read the account of another appearance of the Risen Jesus to his disciples from the Gospel of Luke.

The disciples who travelled on the road to Emmaus and who were joined by the Risen Lord have rushed back to tell the rest that they have met with Jesus. As they are sharing this news with their friends, Jesus himself appears among them and gives that wonderful greeting "Peace be with you."

Of course, in spite of the witness of some, most of them were still to be convinced. Luke tells us they were startled and terrified! We can understand that. Jesus wants them to understand. "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet, see that it is I myself..."

The disciples had to weigh up what is truth and what is lies. We still face this same life and death question, "What is true and what is fake?" Struggling together to strengthen our faith and life, worship and witness is what being part of a Church community is for us. We strive together to serve this world for which Christ died, and we uphold each other with our prayers and fellowship. Let us continue to ask Jesus for his Truth to live in our hearts. Amen.
