Benediction of the Trinity

The grace of the Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Ghost, be with you all. Amen. 2 Cor.13:14

In this benediction, we not only have a statement of the doctrine of the Trinity, but also an expression of the way we encounter the Trinity. We encounter the Trinity first in Christ and the grace he imparts, through whom we experience the love of the Father, and which we enjoy through the communion of the Holy Spirit. If you are a Christian, these realities: the grace of Christ, the love of the Father, and the fellowship of the Spirit, *are yours*. May you embrace them today by faith and live your life in the comfort and strength that comes from the grace and love and fellowship of God who is the Three-in-One.

Go therefore, and make disciples of all nations, baptising them in the name of the Father, and the Son and of the Holy Spirit. (Matt 28:19)



May 26th Trinity Sunday John 3: 1-17

As we reflect on our passage from St. John's Gospel, it doesn't spell out clearly what we believe about the Trinity, because the doctrine of the Trinity only became clear as the Church reflected on the witness of Scripture and the Christian experience, several centuries after the resurrection.

We meet Nicodemus, a man who is seeking the truth, but he visits Jesus by night. He begins by declaring that Jesus is certainly from God, because of the signs and wonders. Jesus answers him, "Very truly I tell you, no one can see the kingdom of God without being born from above."

This throws Nicodemus into a state of confusion. He only saw rebirth as a physical reality, whereas Jesus is pointing to the work of the Spirit 'from above'. The only way of entering God's realm comes 'from above' and is the action of God the Holy Spirit who effects a new creation. Nicodemus is being invited to accept the gift of the 'new'.

This passage has Jesus seemingly at the very centre, but at the very end of the passage we read where God is initiating the redemption of Creation and new life. God refuses to accept a world that is bent on self-destruction. The Divine action is the 'gift' of the Son. It is God who 'loved', 'gave' and 'sent' for the salvation of the world. What a mighty God we serve.
