## **Reflection on the Gospel for Today...The Sabbath Law**

This week we are confronted with an interesting discussion around the keeping of the Sabbath. The law of Moses stated that the Jews were to remember the Sabbath day and keep it holy, making it a day of rest from work, dedicated to the Lord their God.

Over the centuries that followed, the religious leaders placed long lists on what could or could not be done on the Sabbath so that people would not inadvertently break the law. So, when Jesus and his disciples plucked some grain to eat as they walked along the road, the Pharisees questioned Jesus, "Why are you and your disciples breaking the law by harvesting grain on the Sabbath?" His reply was that the Sabbath was made to meet the needs of the people and not for people to meet the needs of the Sabbath.

Entering into the Synagogue, he saw a man with a deformed hand. The Pharisees watched closely; if he healed the man, he would definitely be working and have broken the law. Aware of this, he asked them if the Sabbath was a day to do good deeds, to save life... or destroy it? Telling the man to hold out his hand, Jesus healed him.

Thus, the plot to kill Jesus began! To them, spiritual superiority was based on the rigorous observance of their man-made laws. But the whole point of that original law of Moses was to celebrate and enjoy God's Creation and his care. This became lost when the rule mattered more than the reality.

So, this passage forces us to stop and evaluate. Do we measure our spirituality by some list of do's and don'ts? Or do we take Jesus as our model and concentrate on the spontaneous needs of others with the love and compassion he showed? Can we learn again to live the true spiritual rhythm of work and rest?.....Shalom, Jean.
