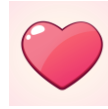

Reflection...A Bracketed Healing...Mark 5: 21-43

Here we have a healing story interrupted by another inside it. Both stories tell of great need and intense desperation. Both tell of faith in Jesus...the faith of a very worried father, and the faith of a desperately ill and marginalised woman. And both are certain that Jesus can bring life out of impending death. However, they come from very different backgrounds.

On the one hand, the family of Jairus represented the "upper crust" of society. Jairus was the ruler of the synagogue...a man of substance, rich and powerful and religiously prominent. But this day, Jairus was troubled. His 12-year-old daughter was dying. In absolute humility, he approaches Jesus, kneels before him, and begs him to come to his home to heal his daughter. And Jesus responds!

On the other hand, the haemorrhaging woman in the crowd was a social outcast. considered unclean, and so not allowed to set foot in the synagogue. Yet, her humility and faith are even greater than that of Jairus. She presses forward, believing if she could just touch Jesus' cloak, she would be healed. And she did, and she was! From 12 years of pain, she had touched the centre of power. Jesus calls her 'daughter' and proclaims that her faith has made her whole.

After this little interlude, the journey towards the home of Jairus continues, even after news of the girl's death. Then, with only 6 people present, Jesus brought Tabitha back to life. These two connected stories tell us so much about Jesus. He is concerned about the prominent and powerful...but he is just as, and even more, open to be touched by the poor anonymous sufferer.

When we suffer, our faith moves us to reach out to touch our loving God, giving us the confidence that God will meet that touch and hear our cry, bringing us into abundant life...Shalom, Jean
