





Reflection on. Mark 7: 1-8, 14-15, 21-23 Pentecost 15

After a long journey through the Gospel of John, we are back to Mark's Gospel, which is the primary Gospel in our B cycle. What a reading we encounter this week! Jesus is engaging with the Pharisees as they criticise his disciples.

The disciples had eaten without observing the correct ritual of washing their hands. For those who were scrupulous about the rituals, this action was enough to bring negative comments from these good religious men.

Jesus answers them, telling them they were more concerned with outward show, than with God's ways. He then calls the crowd to listen to this amazing truth, "Listen to me, all of you, and understand: there is nothing outside a person that by going in can defile, but the things that come out are what defile." (v14b).

He goes on to explain that our hearts and minds are what show whether we follow God's way or life according to the ways of the world; it is sin that builds the barrier between us and God. The Pharisees are people who follow the rules but fail to love God or other people.

This should be a big red flag for us. Are we so 'good and religious' that we fail to see those people who need our care and hospitality? Let us all examine our hearts this week, to see how closely we follow in the steps of Jesus. Our lack of holiness is not shown in breaking the rules of the world, but in our actions that betray our true and often selfish intentions. Blessings, May
