#### Reflection on Mark7:31-37...."Be Opened!"

Jesus does everything well. He even makes the dumb to hear and the deaf to speak. Jesus heals another outsider, a man on the margins, a man who is deaf. He is separated from the rest of the world by his inability to hear and to speak. Jesus takes him away from the prying eyes of the crowd. Fingers pry into his ears, The rabbi spits and touches the man's tongue.... speaks words the man can't yet hear.

But he also makes signs the man can see and gives a touch that he can feel. Jesus places his hands directly on the boundaries that have separated this man from his friends. A word, "Be opened!" and it ends this alienation from sound....from community....from communication with others. Ears, mouth and life are opened!

Then Jesus strongly warns the people not to report what they have witnessed. But they disobey and proclaim the message boldly and widely. Maybe, today, God's people are much better at obeying that command of Jesus...this warning to keep it all a secret! Maybe this is why the church, which once grew like wildfire, seems here in Australia, to be dying down to a few embers. Maybe God's word is not being urgently spoken....and selflessly lived.

Before we judge the church collectively, let's begin with, "What about us?" What is it that Christ says to each one of us that we need to pass on to others with sensitivity and with love? Are *our* ears and mouths open? The Spirit of Christ prompts, urges and guides the words and deeds that are needed for us to spread the message of Salvation and the Kingdom of God.

God will always find a way for us to get the word out; to right the wrongs and help the vulnerable! Jesus does everything well. He even makes the dumb to hear and the deaf to speak. Even us!
