

Reflections: Mark 10: 17 -31

In Mark's gospel reading this week, we meet the Rich Man who couldn't let go of his love of all his possessions in order to follow Jesus. We cannot doubt the man's desire to follow Jesus, as he kneels before him, down in the dust. "Good Teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus calls him to obey the commandments, and the man declares that he does this, and has done so since he was a youth. The man realizes that there is a large hole in his life and Jesus sees the reason. He looks at the man with love: "Sell what you have and give the money to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven, then come and follow me." Of course, the man was filled with grief for he had very many possessions. This caused the disciples concern, so Jesus told them that it is very difficult for

a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven. He says again, "It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle, than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of heaven." The disciples were puzzled! This goes against all sense. If you're rich, everything is possible! Peter rushes in once again, "But we've left everything to follow you." Jesus once again simply and calmly goes to the heart of the matter. Everything you give up for me will be repaid many times over, he says. Then he addresses the imbalance between the measures of life in this world, and the measures of life in heaven... "But many who are first will be last, and the last will be first." What do we love best in life? Anything that stands before our love of God will keep us out of His kingdom. Rev May
