



#### Reflection...Luke 3:15-17, 21-22...Jesus and Us in 2025

John is standing on the banks of the Jordan, preaching repentance. He is telling people that their sins could be forgiven and he's calling them to be baptised, to turn from sin to avoid God's punishment, and to experience his mercy and his approval. John is speaking urgently for he is preparing the people for the coming Messiah, the one who would baptise, not with water, but with the Holy Spirit and the fire of Pentecost to give the power we all need to do God's will.

Enter Jesus! The first declaration of his ministry begins in that river through baptism, through the gift of the Spirit, and through the affirmation of God. As Jesus prays, the Holy Spirit descends on him like a dove and he hears a voice from heaven calling him, 'My son, my beloved.' Through the intimacy of prayer, Jesus knows himself as precious in God's eyes, affirmed in the direction he is taking and empowered to move forward into his assigned role. Clearly, Jesus is the one to whom John points and for whom we all truly hunger.

What about us in 2025? In many unexpected ways and in many unexpected places, God affirms and empowers us to continue Christ's work. Through the power of prayer, the filling of the spirit, the knowledge of God's encompassing love, and the support of God's people, we **can** achieve miracles. We **can** climb over the highest obstacles and tackle the hardest tasks. God's empowering, affirming love will move us beyond ourselves towards those who need God's accepting love ...in whatever ways we may feel challenged to do so...and wherever we might find ourselves.

That's the important message for us all as we move into a new year of discipleship; to be open to shoulder whatever tasks may lie ahead for us to tackle. Be brave! Shalom, Jean
