Reflection on Two Sermons... Nehemiah 8 and Luke 4

Our Old Testament reading describes a very special day in the life of the people of Israel. The exile in Babylon is over and the people have returned once more to their promised land. They are poor, demoralised and frightened. They have returned to face a totally ruined and destroyed city...broken walls, homes and lives! Sounds just like what is happening right now in Gaza as the people return to face their chaos and devastation!

In broken Israel, Nehemiah is sent to help the people rebuild their land. Ezra, a priest and Scribe, becomes their religious leader, destined to help the people rediscover the worship of the one true God. On this day, everyone is gathered into the square and the Torah is read. The Word of God which had been lost, is revealed once more from the words of Moses and the crowd quietens. After Ezra reads for 6 hours, there bursts forth the sound of unrestrained weeping as the people realize how they have strayed from their God and now desperately desire to reconnect.

God speaks through the Scriptures and lives are changed, transformed and renewed.

Years on, in the Synagogue in Nazareth, people have gathered to listen to Jesus read and preach, curious to know what he might say. He takes the scroll and reads from the prophet Isaiah foretelling the role and actions of the Messiah. Then he says, *Today this Scripture is fulfilled in your hearing,* a sermon publicly announcing that he was the promised Messiah... that there is hope for the hopeless.

Two sermons, one very long and one short...both revealing the amazing power of the Word of God. What does this mean to us as we come each Sunday to hear the challenge and the hope of God's Word to us? Repentance? new life? new revelations? new ways to be the Body of Christ? Let us listen carefully for his message to us! Shalom, Jean
