Reflection on Luke 4: 21-30

As we make this journey through the beginning of the ministry and mission of Jesus, it's very fitting that it comes at the beginning of a new year, and perhaps a new beginning for us.

Jesus has come back to Galilee after his baptism

by John in the River Jordan, and his time of temptations in the wilderness. People are very drawn to him, and a good report is circulating about his activities. Remember, at this point, he hasn't called any of his disciples. He comes to Nazareth, his home town, and on the Sabbath, he attends the Synagogue service, as usual. He is invited to read from the scrolls, and chooses the passage from Isaiah, as we heard last week.

The problem arises when Jesus sits down to teach. He makes it clear to all who gathered there, that God's favour rests on everyone, including the Gentiles. The assembly erupts as they realize Jesus is upholding the rights of the Gentiles to experience God's favour. Their racism, hatred and prejudicial thinking overcomes all rational thought. They all arise to take Jesus out of town and throw him over a cliff. God, of course, has other plans.

This passage invites us to examine our hearts and minds, to try to uncover our prejudices and judgmental ways. We are called to be people of compassion, grace and love, but this doesn't apply simply to those who are like us. Loving Jesus, continue to cleanse our hearts and minds, so we may follow you always. Amen. Rev May
