Reflection at the Beginning of Lent....Luke 4:1-13

Lent is the time in our church year bordered on one side by the celebration of the birth of Jesus, God with us, affirmed by the glory of Jesus' Transfiguration, and then on the other side by the wonder of his death and resurrection. During Lent, we remember and reflect on the meaning of the sacrifice of Christ on the cross and on how death was conquered through his resurrection. We marvel once more at the infinite depth of God's love for us.

We observe, we listen, and we open ourselves to the transforming power of God's spirit. We sometimes use these 6 weeks to give up something and use the money saved to help those in need. But it is also a journey, a time to ponder where we are in our faith, where we fail to follow the example of Christ and to walk with him on the road to Calvary, and into the joy of resurrection life.

We begin by following Jesus into the wilderness where he struggles with powerful temptations and triumphs over them. The word, temptation, comes from a Greek word meaning 'experiment.' So, it's a testing, a trial out of which good or evil may come. It creates an opportunity to exercise that little word which seems to have lost its way in our society, that very important little word, *No!*

That's what Jesus did in our reading for today. Jesus says a firm No to the tempter. Satan's offer of bread signifying material security, the Kingdoms offering power and the miracles, religion. Using God's word, he affirms the reign of God and triumphs. He shows us it is possible to face and defeat temptation in our lives. We may fail God, but he doesn't fail us. This Lent, may we come face to face with our God and rely only on him...... Amen Jean




In 2021 the Qld Synod asked us to explore how we could be a blessing to our community.
