

God's Story, Our Story: Hope Growing

We read John's gospel knowing the end of the story and so approach it with excitement. We can't wait to get there; we anticipate the empty tomb. I wonder if we really enter into grief and disillusionment with Mary Magdalen and the Twelve? I think it is time in the shadows that makes the brightness of new life shine more brilliantly.

Mary grieves. She goes to serve her Rabbi in the only way left to her - to anoint his life-less body. Then, panic - it is not there! No wonder she could not understand, only go and tell the bald facts to the others. How heartbreaking! Logic says a missing dead body must have been moved, who would do such a cruel thing? She cannot anoint him, cannot grieve alongside his remains. The others come, check the tomb, go home. She stays at the last place she saw him; she checks the tomb yet again - there are figures seated where Jesus had been.

Surely, she didn't see these strangers go in? Still focused on finding Jesus, she turns away from their questioning and sees another figure. The gardener? He might know where Jesus' body is! And Jesus says her name. "Mary." Suddenly ... her full attention. "Rabbi!" Good news to share indeed!

Reflection...John 18, 19 and 20....Victory over Death

Nothing I could write would do justice to this simple, graphic story of how Jesus brought about our Redemption, our Salvation, our proof that God so loves us that he was willing to sacrifice his Son to bring it all about, giving us victory over sin and death. To take it all in, we need to commit to reading these three chapters deeply and with no interruptions! No matter how often we may have heard or read them over many Easters, the words pack a punch and bring us to our kneels in wonder!

Often, our emphasis is on the jubilation and joy of Easter Sunday with celebration, family and feasting...but this can only happen by moving through the events of that Friday as Jesus takes the full weight of our sin on his shoulders...past, present and future! We are told how he agonised in Gethsemane, how he had to sacrifice his sinlessness for us. We hear his heart-rending cry, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" as our sin separates him from his Father and we wonder about the hot tears God must have shed at this desperate cry. And it was all for us!

We empathise with the desperate sadness ,fear, despair and guilt felt by the disciples, the feeling of desolate, disappointing lostness. But...then comes the Resurrection! Death could not hold him...the sacrifice for us was completed! God, in his infinite and amazing love and grace has made it possible for us to stand before him, sins forgiven through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, our Lord!

We realize that Christ has gone before us, through death and suffering towards eternal life just so we can follow him into peace, love and home with God. That is what these three chapters spell out...That's what Easter proclaims! Death has lost its sting!

Christ has died, Christ has risen, Christ will come again! Shalom, Jean
