On the Fifth Sunday of Lent, we read in John's Gospel the story of Jesus sharing a meal with his good friends (Mary, Martha, and Lazarus) and his disciples. Mary filled with gratitude for her brother's return feels indebted and loves Jesus so much, she must express it in some crazy way. So, she takes some perfume that she had saved and the most valuable thing she owned.

This is an account of abundance, a bewildering, extravagant and crazy act of love. No ordinary gesture but a heartfelt, sacrificial, profound declaration of love and a deep act of gratitude. Abundance is meant to be shared. Every act of giving, whether big or small, mirrors the love and generosity of all that God gave up for us in the giving of his son Jesus. God's desire for us is we might know and experience his deep love for us, we might be transformed and renewed in him. As we take time out in prayer and reflection during this period of Lent, it is my prayer that you will experience and be transformed by the extravagant love of God.

May your life be renewed afresh by the Spirit and may our church experience and reflect God's unlimited love for all people. God's extravagant love might lead us to do the unexpected, so out of the ordinary, that our friends, and yes even our neighbourhoods and community, will think we've gone crazy... crazy with love! ### Reflection for Lent 5....John 12:1-8...What Matters Most?

The Gospel reading for today is leading us ever onwards into the drama of Easter. Here Jesus enters the city of Bethany for the last time. Passing through on his way to the cross, he stops to enjoy a dinner party with his close friends, Mary, Martha and their brother Lazarus. During the dinner, Mary performs a rather controversial deed as she anoints the feet of Jesus with a very expensive jar of perfume, wiping them with her hair, filling the house with the exotic fragrance.

Judas points to the wastefulness, money that could be better used to help the poor and needy...but Jesus rebukes him and alludes to the fact that she was preparing him for burial. Had she poured it over his head, it might have been a declaration that he was the long-awaited Messiah but, to pour it over his feet was something done by the women as they prepared a loved one for burial. Mary knew exactly what she was doing with this extravagant gesture...it was an act of empathetic love and devotion, a giving of what mattered most.

What really matters in this life we are living? Is it the money we have, the status we have achieved, or the knowledge we gain? What matters most? Mary gave us a resounding answer to this question in her extravagant gesture. Mary's gift was both an extravagant act of love and a positive act of faith...a love that made a statement and left a legacy.

There is always something beautiful and fragrant about what we do out of love. No act performed out of a sense of duty or obligation can fill the air with that kind of fragrance. That's what Judas failed to understand. Mary was able to recognise Jesus' special role and relationship with God and she responded to this in actions of discipleship and service.
