Jesus steps into the middle of the room, clearing his throat and holding up a clipboard as he says loudly: "Excuse me, can I have everyone's attention for a minute? I still need *seventy* volunteers for a service opportunity this week. This is a *great* chance to go out into strange and dangerous neighbourhoods and invite yourselves into people's homes. Oh, and *please* remember not to bring *anything* that might make it easier or safer or more comfortable for you to do that, okay? So just come on over here and we'll get you all signed up. Thank you!"

That's no way to recruit volunteers! He wasn't asking for volunteers.

Jesus appoints the seventy and sends them out. He doesn't ask for volunteers, and he doesn't wait to see who comes forward on their own.

I am sending you out, but I'm not sending you unprepared: I'm giving you good news to share and partners to go with you and help share it. That will be enough; go, and you will see.

Let us pray. Gracious and Loving God, you send us out into the world in uncertain times to unfamiliar places entrusting us to bear your good news. Give us courage, patience, humility, and grace that others may hear you calling and may know the abundant life you intend for us all. Through Christ we pray. Amen.

Reflection Luke 10:1-11, 16-20 and 2 Kings 5:1-14!

The readings for this week underline our mission and witness for Christ. We see how God doesn't command sinners to go to church, but for the church to go to sinners, the lost and the seeking! This clearly spells out our call to help others to respond to the gospel and turn to God.

The Old Testament reading tells us about a miracle of healing in an unexpected place which began through the witness of a young slave girl while our Gospel reading tells how Jesus sent his followers out under orders into the harvest God has prepared. "The Harvest is plentiful....but the workers are few. The Kingdom of God is near," says Jesus. "Go, I am sending you out" That's also our orders! Those who know the good news about Jesus are to tell those who don't. Go and teach all nations, Jesus commands.

Both readings tell us about the contributions of ordinary servants of God's kingdom. The Jewish slave girl provides the impetus for Naaman's search for healing when she commands courageously witnesses to the one who can help solve his problem. Then another braves Naaman's wrath and suggests he dunk in the dirty little Jordan river. Small people whose words prompt a miracle!


Similarly, those seventy-two sent by Jesus to proclaim the message of the nearness of the kingdom of God with only Jesus' words as their tools and his presence as their protection as they go to enlist more workers for God's harvest. This is still our calling and our command today: to proclaim and to show the healing love of God to reach out to anyone who will listen and tell them the kingdom of God is near, to meet them where they are and to show them, by our compassion and tender care, that the power of God is at hand.
