Let us honour our veterans, and all those who have served in our Defence Force. As we pay tribute to the fallen, lost in service of our nation. Members of the Defence Force, veterans and their families who proudly gather together, many wearing the medals of their ancestors.

From the arrival of the Australian Army in 1962 almost 60,000 Australians, including ground troops, air force and navy personnel, served in Vietnam; 521 died as a result of the war and over 3,000 were wounded.

The Vietnam war caused great social and political dissent in Australia.

- To the families of those veterans, THANK YOU.
- Be sure sometime soon, you thank a veteran for their service.

Reflections for Luke 12:49-56

Jesus is relentlessly moving towards Jerusalem, towards the cross and he and we know what lies ahead for him. So, his words take on a sense of urgency, a sense of foreboding filled with dire warnings of what can follow those who follow him into his future Kingdom. He's talking to those who already had left family, thrown aside their comfortable lives and were taking his words on board.

But these are tough words from Jesus that we hear today. Don't think I've come to bring peace on the earth! No, I've come to cast fire to burn up the status quo....to fan the flames of passionate faith, that faith that will conquer obstacles and fight fearlessly for the Kingdom of God. This could even happen at the expense of family relationships and past friendships.

And we do know that this happened in the days of the early church. We've heard the stories of Christians being fed to the lions....burnt at the stake....killed in horrific ways. We marvel at the strength of their faith that withstood all the challenges and persecutions that the Emperor Nero and others threw at them. But, then the pages of history continue to be filled with the persecution of people who have stood out fearlessly for their faith. It is still happening in so many places around our world!

What about us? We are not facing death because we are Christians, not being burnt at the stake. However, in Australia, we are still confronted with the necessity of deciding who Jesus is and what that means for us. Do we water down our faith so that we will fit into our prevailing culture? Do we fearlessly stand up for what is right when we see blatant injustice? Following Christ is not life threatening here... although it might still divide families! Jesus has spoken! Shalom, Jean
