Reflection... Luke 13: 10 -17

Our passage opens with Jesus' teaching in the synagogue on the Sabbath, as he so often did. Present was a woman who has been crippled by a spirit for 18 years. I guess the sight of her, bent over and in pain calls out all the compassion in Jesus.

It's the Sabbath, a day when no work should be done. Jesus calls this suffering woman over, declares she is healed, and as he lays his hand on her she stands up straight, and immediately begins praising God.

This healing raised the ire of the religious leaders, as they declared there were six other days for healing. And Jesus calls them to account. "You hypocrites!"

These good religious leaders fail to see that this healing is directly from God. The woman was bound by Satan, and the power of God working through Jesus has set her free.

By condemning the actions of Jesus, they put themselves on the side of Satan. Their spiritual blindness makes them reject the Prophet who can save them and all people. No wonder Jesus weeps over Jerusalem, "the city that kills the prophets and stones those who are sent to it!" (13:34). The crowds who witnessed this healing praise God, along with the woman, praise God, and this gives us a vivid picture of a divided Israel. Like then, now is a time of repentance for failing to see God, and a time of rejoicing when we perceive His presence amongst us. *Rev May*
