Reflection on Haggai:1:15b - 2:9...Sustained Commitment

Sometimes, at crucial moments in life, a single voice can stir a directionless people into action. This is the story from the book of Haggai. Haggai lived in Jerusalem after many of the Jews returned home after being exiled in Babylon. The people started to rebuild the Temple from the ruins of Solomon's Temple, but it seemed too hard and the pressure of other things took over, leaving the task half finished.

The people became engrossed in rebuilding their homes and putting their energies into the planting of new crops...a formidable task! Their priorities became blurred. It was at this point that God sent the prophet Haggai to speak to the discouraged people and to urge them once again to put God first. Haggai gently urges them to give careful thought to their situation. Had neglecting God helped them to get ahead?

The ruins of Solomon's temple stood as a nagging reminder that they had neglected God. They needed to put God first in their lives; they needed to work together to rebuild the temple. What he said must have struck home because the people responded immediately and, in time, the temple was complete! For the people of the Old Testament, the temple symbolised God's presence and so this was the sign that their priorities were now correct in God's sight.

Haggai is an encouraging book for believers of today; it reminds us that blessings lie ahead for those who put God first in their lives. Restoration is not simply returning to what was there before. Restoration is a new act of creation...an act of total commitment. In putting God first, we put ourselves into the centre of that channel through which grace can constantly flow. It's then we find repeated evidence of blessings we do not deserve. Shalom,
