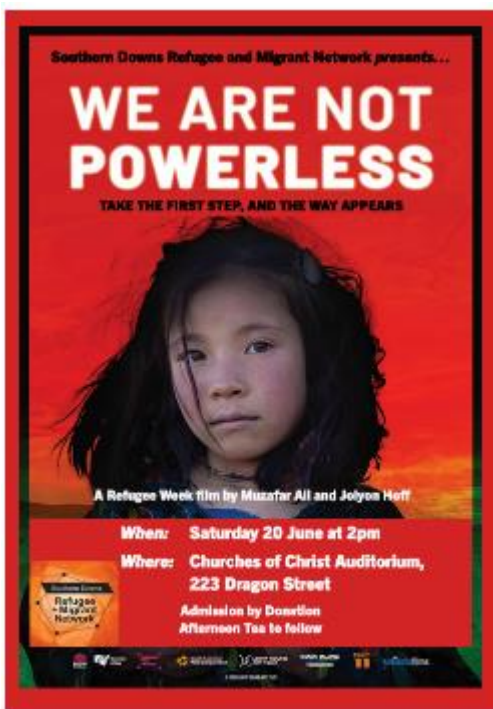

Reflection:

Reflections from Matthew 9: 35- 10:8 (9:23)

This passage today in the Gospel of St. Matthew is linked very closely with the 'Great Commission' in Matthew 28. Of course, we know that the gospels were written several decades after the events, so it's easy to see how the commission to 'make disciples of all the nations' is reflected in this call on the disciples to 'go out to gather in the harvest' (Matthew 9: 37).

There are several aspects of this passage that teach us much. First of these is that the task of the disciples is to be rooted in the activity of Jesus. We have been informed that Jesus is travelling around Galilee preaching of the Kingdom of God, teaching in the Synagogues, and healing every disease and infirmity. These disciples are not called to blaze a trail for themselves, but to follow the path Jesus has established.

Secondly, we see where Jesus has great compassion for the crowds who flock to him. They are harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd. In Matthew's Gospel, the crowds are never portrayed as enemies of Jesus, but as those who are lost and vulnerable. Although they are often amazed at the words and deeds of Jesus, they remain without faith.

Thirdly, Jesus sees these crowds as a bounteous harvest. We may see the crowds who observe us as a nuisance at best, and enemies at worst, but we seldom have a heart to reach out to them with the Good News of Jesus.

As we read the list of those who are commissioned, and those who are included in this mission this whole passage takes on a remarkable quality. Matthew, the tax collector, an outsider in society, Simon the Canaanite even more of an outsider, and Judas Iscariot who betrayed Him. How could we imagine that we are not called?? Blessings, May
