So, it was in the desert place. At dusk, Jesus played host to five thousand hungry people. It was an open table.

He did not ask whether they were all believers or not, nor insist on conformity to a creed, or say only the morally good folk deserved to eat. No exclusion of the young or women, nor the tax collectors or other sinners. All were welcome at his table under the open heavens.

He said the blessing and broke the bread. He then gave the broken bread to his disciples, who distributed the food among the crowd. So, they all ate and were satisfied. Yet at the end of the meal the disciples gathered up the left-overs, and found there were still twelve full baskets.

This wonderful adequate host as much at home under the open sky, in a weather board country chapel or in an ornate city cathedral, has food to share with whoever may come. As we gather at one of his tables, the menu is simple and spare. A fragment of bread and a sip from the Cup. Yet it is more than enough.

To be totally satisfied to the roots of one's being, depending on neither quantity but on quality. They were content. Can we be content, even in our deserts of the soul.

Reflection on Matthew 14:13-21...More than Enough

Jesus has just learnt of the death of his relative, John the Baptist, and he looks for a quiet, solitary place in the desert to mourn and pray, far from villages and people. But the crowds follow him and, in his unbounded compassion, he becomes involved in their needs and finds his own grief begin to fade.

Time passes, and as the sun begins to set, the crowd is still with Jesus out in that desert not wanting to leave the presence of this remarkable and loving rabbi. But it is obvious they are hungry. The disciples urge Jesus to order them to leave and find food for themselves in the nearest village. But that's not the way of Jesus, that's not the way of compassion. He tells his disciples to give them something to eat and they shrug and say, "With what?"

But, in this desert place, Jesus shows us all how to react. The disciples see only the scarcity of their resources...just a couple of fish and a few loaves of bread! But Jesus takes what they have, blesses it, breaks it and gives it out ...and it is more than enough for all to eat, with 12 baskets of food left over. What a massive abundance from such a small offering, a gift offered to all the hungry to be fed.

We look at the vast and urgent needs of our world today, and despair. Like those disciples, we feel the task ahead is beyond us, and we turn away. Jesus asks us, "What do you have?" Not much to help so many! Then he urges us to take what we have, give it to Him and, in his almighty compassion, it will feed the hungry and the hurting of our world. Just offer the little we have to him, and it will be enough...in fact more than enough!
